TECHNOLOGY/AGRICULTURE/FFA NEWS

High School Technology

High School Technology is very fortunate to offer three courses to students: Woodworking, Technical Drawing and Design and Drawing for Production (DDP). Woodworking is an upper-level course open to students who are pursuing advanced work in the concepts of design, carpentry and construction. Some projects that were completed this year include leopold benches, adirondack chairs, clocks, ribbon rack and nail boxes. Students were able to focus on handson learning while working in a shop space safely.

Technical Drawing and DDP provide students with a working knowledge of 2-D and 3-D graphic representation. This year was an exciting time for students in both classes because they were able to dive into and understand drawing of objects in isometric, orthographic and 1-point perspective. After understanding the basic principles of drawing, they jumped into designing different woodworking projects including shelves, barn quilts, clocks and geometric designs.

Middle School Technology

Middle School Technology covered a wide range of topics this year that kept the 7th and 8th graders engaged with hands-on learning during their guarter and half-year segments. During Technology, students learn about coding, motion, design, technical drawing, agriculture technology and woodshop. Projects that were enjoyed included stomp rockets, egg drop, wood burning, birdhouses and greenhouse design. Technology is rapidly changing, which allows these students to cover a wide range of topics that aligns with how technology is evolving in the real world.

High School Agriculture

This year has been an exciting one for High School students! Students were able to choose from four half-year high school courses, three of which were brand new this year! In Agriculture Power and Technology (APT) students were exposed to mechanics, power, technology and career options in the world of agriculture. While participating in APT, students experienced mechanical and engineering concepts while performing hands-on activities, with two to three labs per week. Some projects that students completed included a friction lab, a concrete lab, where students got to make and test their own concrete and multiple energy labs that included the construction of windmills.

In Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources (AFNR) students explored careers in the areas of agriculture, plants, animals, the food industry and natural resources. Students learned units in communication, the science of agriculture, plants, animals, natural resources and agricultural mechanics. Students were able to survey the opportunities available in agriculture and natural resources, conduct research, analyze data, work in teams while doing labs based on soil testing, circuit boards, cannoli making and much more!

The first year of Food Science was exciting this year! Students gained a better understanding in the areas of food sources, product testing and development, food preparation and preservation and careers related to the food industry. Students investigated areas of food science including food safety, food chemistry, food processing, food product development and marketing. Some projects included a bacterial growth lab, meat fat lab, starch labs and much more!

In Animal Science students studied history and domestication, handling and behavior, anatomy and physiology, nutrition, health, selection and marketing. Some classroom activities included an animal handling lab, digestion murals and grooming.

Middle School Agriculture

Middle School students had the opportunity to explore agriculture through quarter-long segments. During the ten weeks, 6th, 7th and 8th graders spent time learning about FFA, communication, animal science, plant science, natural resources, food science and floral design. Some highlights of the year included making pumpkin and holiday centerpieces, courtesy of Springside Farms and Luchsinger's Tree Farm. Students also did labs related to butter making, apple pie making, tree identification, dairy feed identification, vegetable planting and much more!

FFA

The F-P Chapter of Future Farmers of America has grown significantly throughout the past year. We officially received our National Charter in the fall, so we are now recognized as an official part of the organization. We have roughly 25-30 Middle School and High School members, as well as 6 officers. Our chapter meets twice a month to discuss upcoming events, both local and state, as well as socialize and participate in team-bonding activities. We did two fundraisers this year and were fortunate enough to receive a few donations from local businesses and the Onondaga County Farm Bureau. We had students participate in state competitions and place on the state level. In April, we went on farm tours to local farms and agribusinesses. Students were able to meet community members, learn about farm/business and job opportunities in their future. In May, we took 14 students to the NY State FFA Convention in Syracuse. Students competed in events, went on diverse tours, attended leadership workshops and interacted with over 2,000 FFA members. At the end of May, we celebrated all of our FFA members' accomplishments at our first annual FFA banquet. Congratulations to Elsa Hull who participated in Sr. Creed at the State level and placed third. We are very proud of your accomplishments!

Health Examinations

New York State law requires a health examination for all students entering the school district for the first time and/or when entering grades **Kindergarten**, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th and 11th. A New York State licensed physician, physician assistant or nurse practitioner must complete the examination. It is required to be on the **NYS health examination form**. Our school physician will be available for examinations. If a copy is not received, the school nurses will contact you. Vision, hearing and scoliosis are mandated screenings on health examinations in specific grades. If screening is not documented on the health form by the HCP, the school nurses are required to complete the screenings.

All physical examinations completed for the 2022-2023 school year should be mailed or emailed to the school, attention to the school nurses.

A dental certificate which states that your child has been seen by a dentist or dental hygienist is requested but not required at this time.

Immunizations

New York State Law Section 2164 requires certain immunizations to enter and attend school. Proof of current vaccinations is **required by the first day of the school year** for attendance. Please follow the NYS Department of Health immunization schedule: *School Year New York State Immunization Requirements for School Entrance/Attendance*.

In addition:

- Students entering 6th grade or by 11 years of age must have the *Tdap* vaccine and 2 doses of the *Varicella (Chickenpox)* vaccine.
- Students entering 7th grade are required to have one dose of the meningococcal vaccine.
- Students entering 12th grade are required to have 2 doses of the *meningococcal* vaccine or 1 dose if the first was received at age 16 or older.


