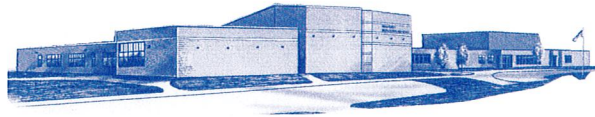

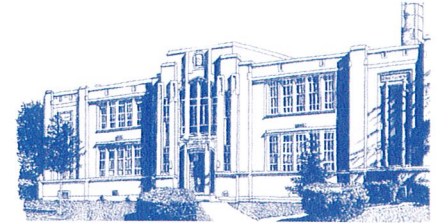

Dear Parents/Guardians/Faculty/Staff:

Yesterday, Wednesday, October 14, 2020, you were informed that the District had been notified regarding a second faculty member from the Fabius-Pompey Central School District's Middle School-High School, who had tested positive for the COVID-19 virus. When the District received news of the second positive case, the Onondaga County Health Department had already quarantined 56 students in the Middle School-High School as well as one teacher from the first case which was announced on October 10. The quarantine period for the first group, if no other cases evolve, will end on Saturday, October 17, 2020.

The second positive case, reported to the District on Tuesday, October, 13, 2020 also involved a Middle School-High School teacher as well as 56 students and one additional teacher from the Middle School-High School. This case is unrelated to the first. This second group of students and 2 teachers have been quarantined by the Onondaga County Health Department until midnight on Thursday, October 22, 2020.

After consulting with the Onondaga County Health Department, and due to the number of students required to quarantine, the Middle School-High School will continue remote learning through Thursday, October 22, 2020. The goal is to return to in-person learning on Friday, October 23, 2020.

The Elementary School, grades kindergarten through 5, will continue to have in-person classes.

I understand the frustration experienced by students, parents, teachers and administrators by the seemingly unpredictable nature of this virus. We are working hard to limit the possibility of it spreading within school. The extension of remote learning through the quarantine period will help the Middle School-High School return to in-person learning.
