



Hello, Fabius-Pompey Parents and Community:

It is with great joy that I am able to announce the start of a Universal Prekindergarten Program (UPK) at the Fabius-Pompey Elementary School this fall. The program is available through state funding and a pending grant. This is a very exciting opportunity for our younger students and community as a whole; it is our hope that a UPK program will be able to provide our youngest students with the social, emotional, and academic skills they need to successfully enter kindergarten. UPK will help to enhance the students' language/communication skills, early literacy/critical thinking skills, as well as their social/emotional development and motor skills.

The program will be available to all students in the district who are four years old by December 1, 2023. The district will not implement a lottery system, and all eligible students will have a seat in a UPK classroom.

Much more information will follow in the weeks ahead regarding registration, screening, orientation, and program details.
