FROM LLOYD L. PECK, ED.D. SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Happy New Year!!! Unfortunately, we are not starting 2022 off the way we had hoped in terms of COVID-19 and the continual rise of the Omicron variant. I wanted to take time to update the community on the status of the District in terms of continuing in-person instruction and the possibility of switching to virtual instruction.

The staff have been given instructions to inform their students to take home everything they would need in the case the District was forced to move to virtual instruction. If the decision is made to switch to virtual instruction, it would be made quickly, and students may not have the opportunity to come back into the buildings to retrieve items they may need.

Switching to virtual instruction will be an absolute last resort in dealing with the pandemic. The staff at Fabius-Pompey has done an incredible and unprecedented job stepping up and filling in for those staff members who have been affected by the virus and are unable to be in school. The District has been able to stay in session each day due to the simple fact that staff have covered classes for their colleagues. Without this dedication by our staff, the District would have been forced to switch to virtual instruction immediately following the holiday break.

The District recognizes very clearly that the best place for our students to be is in school each and every day, and we will continue to make that priority number one. To be clear, the District will only switch to virtual instruction when we do not have the staff to safely and efficiently educate the students on our campus.

As Superintendent, I am in constant contact with area superintendents as well as the Onondaga County Health Department. The District has sent home, with each student who wanted one, an iHealth COVID-19 Antigen Rapid Test that was provided by the county. The District will also launch the Test to Stay (TTS) program in mid-January as another way to keep the students in school. Onondaga County has also decreased the quarantine time for essential workers down to 5 days from 10 days if the person is not symptomatic and/or has recovered from the virus. More information about the quarantine period can be found at https://covid19.ongov.net/isolation-quarantine/. Both the TTS program and the new quarantine guidance will allow staff to either stay in school or return to the campus quicker.

In closing, the District is doing everything it is able to do to keep our students coming to school each day, but they should be prepared to switch to virtual instruction if the need arises. I will continue to keep the community updated as new information arises.

TEST TO STAY PROTOCOL

What does "Test to Stay" mean?

"Test to Stay" (TTS) is a test-based protocol for K-12 students and staff who have been exposed to COVID-19 due to a school exposure only and are asymptomatic and unvaccinated. With parent consent, it allows these students to attend only school-based instruction/academic periods in person during the quarantine period as long as they test negative for COVID-19 daily and have no symptoms of COVID-19.

Per New York State Department of Health guidance, the exposed student who is allowed to remain in school through TTS must still be quarantined outside of school instruction/academic periods. During the TTS period, the student will not be able to participate in extracurricular activities including clubs, sports, arts/performance and must quarantine through X number of days (awaiting clarification from NYSDOH).

Individuals exposed to a positive case outside of a school exposure will not qualify for this program and are expected to follow the normal quarantine protocol.

Protocol for reporting all COVID-19 test results

All COVID-19 test results will be reported each school day to the New York State COVID-19 report card, including TTS results. Test to Stay results will be reported to the Electronic Clinical Laboratory Reporting Systems (ECLRS) daily by the designated individual in the District. The District will comply with all reporting obligations under public health law.

Process to ensure equity

All parents/guardians of students who have a school-based exposure will have the opportunity to participate in TTS. Students will be allowed to be transported to school on the school bus in order to get tested on a school day. All tests will be provided by the Onondaga County Health Department and there will not be a cost for parents/guardians to have their child(ren) participate in the program.

Parent/Guardian consent

All parents/guardians will receive a consent form via SchoolMessenger that will need to be signed and returned to the school office to provide permission for participating in the TTS program.

Testing

If a student is participating in the TTS program, the student will be given a COVID-19 rapid antigen test daily on school days before the school day begins. The test will be administered under the supervision of the school nurse. A designated staff member from the District will be responsible for reporting the test results in ECLRS. A negative test will allow the student to remain in school. Should the student test positive, they will be required to be picked up by their parent/guardian and follow the isolation protocol. The student will have to remain in an isolation room until parent/guardian is notified and has to pick up the child to bring them home.

REQUESTS FOR TRANSPORTATION TO PRIVATE AND PAROCHIAL SCHOOLS

Requests for transportation to private and parochial schools for the 2022-2023 school year must be received by the District Office by April 1. A request form is available on the District website on the Transportation homepage. Requests must be renewed annually.

There are three basic financial aid forms:

- FAFSA (free) This is the application for federal aid (www.fafsa. ed.gov).
- **TAP (free)** This is the application for NY state aid (www.hesc. ny.gov).
- PROFILE (fee) This form is used only by certain colleges and has a fee. Submit only to those that require it! (https://cssprofile.collegeboard.org)

College bound seniors should have completed their FAFSA, TAP and any other financial forms by this time.

Families who have not filed should do so soon in order to be considered for all available financial aid programs.

In December, the Middle School presented the musical *Moana* for both an in-person and a live streamed crowd. Students did a fantastic job preparing for their roles, and for many students, this was a first time experience either on stage or backstage on stage crew or tech. The 4th and 5th grade held their first Chorus Concert on December 8 in the Middle School-High School auditorium. Both groups were conducted by Ms. Kate Hale.
