Information Regarding Entrance into 6th Grade

The New York State Department of Health (NYS Law Section 2164) requires that all students entering the 6th grade OR by 11 years of age **MUST** have a Tdap vaccine. *This is a mandate for students to attend school.* All health care providers are aware of this mandate. Please send updated records to the MS-HS Health Office.

Information Regarding Entrance into 7th and 12th Grade

The New York State Department of Health (NYS Law Section 2164) requires that all students entering 7th and 12th grade have the meningococcal vaccine prior to starting school. All 12th grade students are required to have been given two doses of the meningococcal vaccine, unless the first dose was received at 16 years of age or older. *This is a mandate for students to attend school.* All health care providers are aware of this mandate. Please send updated records to the MS-HS Health Office.

HIGH SCHOOL SCIENCE NEWS

The AP Chemistry and AP Biology classes took their annual field trip on the William Scandling, Hobart and William Smith Colleges' 65-foot research vessel, to take part in "Science On Seneca," an EPA award-winning environmental education program. The students were able to visit the college and hear a lecture by a geology professor, and they were able to gain experience conducting various water sampling tests using the same equipment and techniques used by experts in the field.



The chemistry students conducted tests for pH, and dissolved oxygen at multiple sampling sites and depths, as well as testing the chloride levels, which gives indication of the effect of past salt mining on Seneca Lake. The biology students sampled plankton populations to indicate water quality, and made observations on the size and effects of the invasive zebra mussel and quagga mussel populations plaguing the Finger Lakes Region. The data that the students collected is to become a part of the larger body of data collected through this program, which has been helping scientists analyze data trends in the lake for over 20 years.

A short stop in Verona included a visit to “Juliet’s balcony,” a renaissance era bridge built to defend the city from attackers, and a Roman era arena/amphitheater. Our next day was filled with boat rides from mainland Italy to three different islands: Murano, Burano and Venice. In Venice we all got a chance to ride in a gondola and wonder how interesting it would be to live in a city without streets. On our final day in Italy, we headed north to Lake Como and the picturesque city of Bellagio.

The next morning, our group woke up in Switzerland to the most amazing view of snow-covered mountains in every direction. This was just the beginning of the jaw-dropping views. Besides the view, we had the opportunity to watch three Swiss daredevils jump off the mountain, slowly paragliding to the bottom right in front of us. The rest of the day was spent in Lucerne, with hours of freetime to explore the city in smaller groups. To top off the day, we were treated to dinner and a show of Swiss culture. Students got a chance to get on stage and play the ten-foot-long alpine horn, dance and of course yodel!

After an early morning bullet train ride to Paris (speeds around 180 mph), we were immediately immersed in the most visited city in the world. With lots of free time to explore the historic areas of Paris, many of us took the opportunity to sit outside a Parisian cafe and see why France is considered one of the great culinary cultures. Some of the highlights of Paris included a bus tour of its famous landmarks, a riverboat cruise down the Seine, The Louvre, Montmartre and Versailles. Our numerous “food explorers” took up a challenge to try the local cuisine. Students ate Squid Ink Risotto, Escargot (snails), Beef Tartare (raw ground beef) and Frog Legs! We believe this, more than anything, is a great summary of what this trip (and future trips) are all about. It can be a life-changing experience to spend a few days living a different lifestyle. We hope every single one of our travelers learned something new about the world and more importantly, themselves!
