FROM THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

We would like to begin by extending a heartfelt thank you to our community for your continued support for Fabius-Pompey in passing the budget. The budget was approved with a strong supermajority vote of 63.5%. Thank You!

Despite a nearly 1% reduction in next year's spending plan compared to the current budget, the expiration of COVID-related funding and a state aid increase limited to just 2% have significantly impacted our financial outlook. To help balance the budget, and in addition to a necessary tax increase, we regretfully have had to make difficult staffing decisions. With heavy hearts, we implemented some staff reductions and chose not to fill certain positions vacated through retirement.

Thanks to strategic scheduling and the dedication of our remaining staff, we are proud to report that all programming has remained intact. To those individuals who are leaving the District, we extend our deepest gratitude for your service and unwavering commitment to the Fabius-Pompey students. Our mission remains centered on the students, and we are continually inspired by the way our staff goes above and beyond every day.

Following last month's election, we also welcome changes to our Board of Education. We are pleased to extend a warm welcome to our newest members, Lari Rutherford and Rachel-Storm Heasley. At the same time, we wish to express our sincere appreciation to Holly Frazee for her 6 years of service, and to John Repak, who has dedicated an extraordinary 25 school years to the Fabius-Pompey Board. Their experience and insight will be greatly missed.

In other news, we recently opened bids for the capital project and were pleased to receive competitive proposals that came in under budgeted projections. Work on site improvements and select interior upgrades will begin this summer and continue through the upcoming school year, extending into next summer.

As we round out the 2024-2025 school year, the Board would like to take a moment to celebrate all the accomplishments of our students and dedicated staff.

Our students have demonstrated strong academic performance across all grade levels. We are proud to report a 98% graduation rate for our 2025 senior class. At the middle school level, 86% of our students earned honor roll throughout this year and at the high school level, 74% of our students earned the honor roll distinction. These results underscore the commitment to learning demonstrated by our students and the quality of instruction provided by our teachers and staff.

During the summer months, the district will continue to support student learning at the elementary level through our Summer Enrichment Program. This program provides valuable educational opportunities for continued growth for our K-5 students.

Additionally, the district will be implementing the Summer Bus Safety Program this summer, a grant-funded initiative focused on enhancing student transportation safety and addressing violations related to passing stopped school buses.

Finally, to the Fabius-Pompey graduating Class of 2025, the Board of Education extends our sincerest congratulations to each and every one of you. Whether pursuing higher education, entering the workforce or serving in the military, we know you are ready for whatever comes next. Your time with us has prepared you well and we cannot wait to see all the amazing things you will accomplish. Congratulations!!

HEALTH OFFICE NEWS

School/Sports Physical Reminder. Physical examinations are required in order to participate in interscholastic athletics at the modified, junior varsity and varsity levels. No student will be permitted to practice with their team unless this requirement is met. Please make sure your student has a current physical on file with the Health Office if they are planning on participating in a sport during the upcoming school year.

Information Regarding Entrance into 6th Grade. The New York State Department of Health (NYS Law Section 2164) requires that all students entering the 6th grade OR by 11 years of age MUST have a Tdap vaccine. This is a mandate for students to attend school. All health care providers are aware of this mandate. Please send updated records to the Middle School-High School Health Office.

Information Regarding Entrance into 7th and 12th Grade. The New York State Department of Health (NYS Law Section 2164) requires that all students entering 7th and 12th grade have the meningococcal vaccine prior to starting school. All 12th grade students are required to have been given two doses of the meningococcal vaccine, unless the first dose was received at 16 years of age or older. This is a mandate for students to attend school. All health care providers are aware of this mandate. Please send updated records to the Middle School-High School Health Office.

FABIUS-POMPEY STEAM ACADEMY: YEAR IN REVIEW

This year, the Fabius-Pompey STEAM Academy gave students exciting opportunities to learn through hands-on projects, new technology, and real-world problem solving.

Elementary STEAM Highlights

We opened a brand-new **STEAM Lab** at the Elementary School. Students used VEX robots, 3D printers, LEGO kits, and more for hands-on learning. With support from A.P.T.S. and staff training sessions, the lab quickly became a favorite learning space. Next year, we’ll add more lesson kits and run new staff workshops.

Fifth-grade students participated in weekly **STEAM Fridays**, working on creative engineering projects. We also launched our first **LEGO League** Explore team for 4th graders and plan to expand the program with a LEGO Challenge team for grades 6-9 in the fall. Both programs made great use of the new STEAM Lab, giving students space to build, collaborate, and test ideas.

Middle and High School Highlights

All 8th graders completed our new **Computer Science 8** course, which included coding, robotics, and digital citizenship. The course provides middle-level CTE credit and builds a foundation for future tech learning.

The **Student LAN Tech** program continued to provide district tech support during the school day and summer. Student techs helped reduce outside service costs and gained valuable experience along the way.

Our **Esports** team had 15 members compete in the Elite Gaming League. Several teams reached the playoffs, held in person in downtown Syracuse. We are now looking at ways to grow the program further, including local tournaments and expanded game offerings.

The **AI Learning Group** for staff selected SchoolAI as the district platform for 2025-2026 and will continue exploring how AI can support teaching and learning.

Expanding CTE Opportunities

Our **Business and Finance CTE Program** completed its first year, supporting students with industry testing, work-based learning experiences, and career prep. The new **Business Speaker Series** gave students monthly access to professionals from the field and will continue next year.

We’re also excited to launch our approved **Agriculture CTE Program** in fall 2025. Next year, we’ll begin planning for a **Technology-based CTE Program** to expand student options even further.

With continued support from our community and staff, we’re ready to grow the STEAM Academy even further next year!
