


Congratulations to Our High School Science Olympiad Team

FROM LLOYD L. PECK, ED.D. SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

As spring is in the air, it is a busy time in all schools across central New York. Spring signals the rebirth of the trees that start blooming again and the leaves, flowers, grass and birds seem to come back to life. This change can also be seen in our students as they get ready to play spring sports, wrap up the third marking period, pack away their winter clothing and look to a fresh new season and ending the school year on a strong note.

On Wednesday, March 2, Governor Hochul lifted the state-imposed mask mandate on school districts that has been in effect for almost two years. I realize COVID is still a threat, and the pandemic is not officially over, but this is the first step for schools to really get back to a normal setting.

As we wrap up this marking period, it is hard to believe that we are almost three quarters of the way through this year. I want to encourage us all to carry on with the energy that spring will bring. We need to continue strong and finish the school year on a positive note. It will take all of us to help our amazing students to be able to show how far they have come this year.

Lastly, as you drive through the campus you will start to notice that we are beginning a new branding of the District. We are not changing the colors or the mascot, but we are starting to promote the District and its proud heritage. Through very generous donations from Watchdog, Leonard Bus, Reagan Insurance and Ferrara Fiorenza PC, the District was able to purchase 50 banners. The banners are red and white and depict the school colors as well as a beautiful falcon. They say, "Fabius Pompey – Home of the Falcons." The banners will be displayed prominently on the light poles throughout the campus and will be a welcoming sight for visitors, alumni and our current students, faculty and community.

MIDDLE SCHOOL-HIGH SCHOOL NEWS Kevin Linck, Principal

As we pass the two-year anniversary of the "shutdown" that came as a result of the start of the pandemic, it is worth taking note of the changes that we have seen, and what we can do to combat some of the things that have developed.

The nation and the world seem divided in a variety of ways. This is not a political statement (though it is easy to see at the national and state governmental levels), it is meant as a window into what our children and students see. Angry, vitriolic conversations, protests, and constant reminders of the dangers and problems are difficult for anyone, especially children, to digest. What this has led to is an increase in anxiety and stress, as well as depression in our young people. What we have noted within students is a drastic increase in anxiety. Some of the symptoms of anxiety include dizziness, muscle tension, digestive issues (including nausea and diarrhea), trouble sleeping, anger or irritability, headaches, increased sweating, feelings of being overwhelmed, restlessness, changes in appetite, increased heart rate, etc. It is difficult for students to focus on their academics, as well as other parts of their lives when there are increased levels of anxiety. It has also led to many coming up with their own coping strategies to deal with the anxiety/stress, and many of these coping strategies are negative, and potentially dangerous. If you have concerns about these things with your child, it is important to get support for them, as there are a number of resources available to help.

Another issue certainly has been the potential of learning loss related to the pandemic. We continually assess students within classes, and there are a variety of standardized tests that help to show potential issues that help teachers and the school to identify areas to support students. Whether it is a classroom assessment, AIMSweb, IXL, Regents exams, or 3-8 assessments that students take, they are critical to understanding what we need to do to help students. Often, people have thought that these are high stakes tests, and it could be argued the high stakes are the support we can provide with the data that they provide. We are offering online tutoring each day, and it is not just for those who are quarantined or isolated. It is a great time to meet with a teacher for help on homework, help with problems, and when they know who is there, prepare for an exam they might have coming up.

While this is a very challenging time, there are things in place to assist students with the myriad of issues brought on by the experiences of the last couple of years. There are many resources and supports out there that are valuable if your child is struggling. Communication is the key to ensuring that your child gets the support that they need.




















HIGH SCHOOL ENGLISH NEWS


Over the past several weeks, my students and your children have been working with the classic novel *Lord of the Flies* by William Golding.

To engage the students while reading chapter one, they created a microcosm of the island in groups. They used play-doh, shells, stones, sticks and gems to paint a picture of the island before it went up in flames. Every single display was different; they laughed and enjoyed creating these microcosms! This activity is portrayed in the pictures below.

Furthermore, the students created masks to show that when hiding behind a mask, a person's humanity can be altered. This happened to the character Jack in the novel who loses his humanity and becomes a savage, not feeling any emotion with the death of Simon and Piggy, or when going after Ralph at the end of the novel.

Throughout the novel each student was also assigned a chapter to create a one-pager that portrayed analysis, themes, topics, symbols and characters throughout. Finally, the students created a comic strip showing how the devil within the boys and more specifically, the "Lord of the Flies" swallowed up Simon's kind soul. These activities are portrayed below as well.

Lord of the Flies is a difficult text, but the students pushed through and enjoyed it. They are now working on their research projects where they chose a topic to research that relates to the novel, and in groups they will be creating a research paper and google slides presentation that they will present to the class.
