

FROM LLOYD L. PECK, ED.D. SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

I have mentioned it in several newsletters, but as a new superintendent to the District, I find myself being more and more impressed with the community support the District has received. Recently, the community passed the 2022-2023 school budget with an almost 80 percent pass rate, one of the highest rates anywhere in the area. The school board, as well as the administration, puts a lot of time, effort and careful preparation into the financial planning each school year in an effort to keep the tax rate as low as possible and at the same time offer the highest academic instruction possible. Mr. Repak and Mrs. Frazee were re-elected to three-year terms as members of the Board of Education. On behalf of the Board of Education, as well as the School District, thank you for your support.

As we prepare for our final month of school before summer break, please take a moment to reflect on the school year with your student. It has been a very difficult school year with COVID-19 and the regulations that it brought. Mental health is on the forefront of all our minds as we see increasing occurrences of senseless and tragic acts of violence in our nation and even in our own state. Many of the heartbreaking events are being linked to the pandemic and the toll it took on the social and emotional health of people of all ages. As a district, we recognize the impact the pandemic has had on our community, staff and students. I would like to remind parents and students that the District has school counselors, social workers and school psychologists ready to help the students every day with any concerns they may have, either academic or personal. During these chaotic times we must be here to support one another.



Students with only afternoon tests may provide their own transportation. Those who need to arrive on the morning bus run, as well as those who arrive earlier than the scheduled exam, should report to the cafeteria study hall until the testing time. Students who finish exams early and are awaiting District transportation should report to the cafeteria until buses arrive. Once students arrive at school, either by bus or by their own transportation, they should enter and remain in school until their last test is finished. Students are not permitted to leave school and return later in the day, either for exams or for District transportation.

Return of school materials: Students are expected to return all school materials (textbooks, library books, etc.) in good condition before the end of the school year. Library books should be returned no later than the date announced by the library staff. Textbooks should be returned by the student at the beginning of the last examination for the course. Those who do not return textbooks at the time of the exam will indicate so in writing.

Health Examinations

New York State law requires a health examination for all students entering the school district for the first time and/or when entering grades **Kindergarten**, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th and 11th. A New York State licensed physician, physician assistant or nurse practitioner must complete the examination. It is required to be on the **NYS health examination form**. Our school physician will be available for examinations. If a copy is not received, the school nurses will contact you. Vision, hearing and scoliosis are mandated screenings on health examinations in specific grades. If screening is not documented on the health form by the HCP, the school nurses are required to complete the screenings.

All physical examinations completed for the 2022-2023 school year should be mailed or emailed to the school, attention to the school nurses

A dental certificate which states that your child has been seen by a dentist or dental hygienist is requested but not required at this time.

Immunizations

New York State Law Section 2164 requires certain immunizations to enter and attend school. Proof of current vaccinations is **required by the first day of the school year** for attendance. Please follow the NYS Department of Health immunization schedule: *School Year New York State Immunization Requirements for School Entrance/Attendance*.

In addition:

- Students entering **6**th **grade** or by 11 years of age must have the *Tdap* vaccine and 2 doses of the *Varicella (Chickenpox)* vaccine.
- Students entering 7th grade are required to have one dose of the meningococcal vaccine.
- Students entering 12th grade are required to have 2 doses of the meningococcal vaccine or 1 dose if the first was received at age 16 or older.
