

Students with only afternoon tests may provide their own transportation. Those who need to arrive on the morning bus run, as well as those who arrive earlier than the scheduled exam, should report to the cafeteria study hall until the testing time. Students who finish exams early and are awaiting District transportation should report to the cafeteria until buses arrive. Once students arrive at school, either by bus or by their own transportation, they should enter and remain in school until their last test is finished. Students are not permitted to leave school and return later in the day, either for exams or for District transportation.

Return of school materials: Students are expected to return all school materials (textbooks, library books, etc.) in good condition *before* the end of the school year. Library books should be returned *no later than* the date announced by the library staff. Textbooks should be returned by the student at the *beginning* of the *last examination* for the course. Those who do not return textbooks at the time of the exam will indicate so in writing.



Information Regarding Entrance into 6th Grade

The New York State Department of Health (NYS Law Section 2164) requires that all students entering the 6th grade OR by 11 years of age *MUST* have a Tdap vaccine. *This is a mandate for students to attend school.* All health care providers are aware of this mandate. The New York State Department of Health (NYS Law Section 2164) requires that all students entering 7th and 12th grade have the meningococcal vaccine prior to starting school. All 12th grade students are required to have been given two doses of the meningococcal vaccine, unless the first dose was received at 16 years of age or older. *This is a mandate for students to attend school.* All health care providers are aware of this mandate. Please send updated records to the MS-HS Health Office.
