eSPORTS CLUB NEWS

Fabius-Pompey Middle School-High School Launches Competitive eSports Program

Did you know?

The 2019 League of Legends Championships had more viewers than the Super Bowl? The League of Legends World Championship finals — held in South Korea and also hosted by the game's publisher, Riot Games — showed that almost 100 million unique viewers tuned in to the event online. For comparison, 2018's Super Bowl had just over 98 million viewers, the smallest viewership number for the event since 2008." ¹

What is eSports?

eSports is competitive-level gaming, on teams and as individuals, depending on the game. We are excited to introduce this unique opportunity to our students at Fabius-Pompey Middle School-High School. Participants in grades 7-12 who choose to participate as a gamer in our eSports program may have the opportunity to compete against students in other local districts, across the state, and potentially nation-wide. Students will have access to Nintendo Switch systems during meetings to practice, scrimmage, and compete in the following games: Mario Kart 8 Deluxe, Super Smash Brothers Ultimate, Splatoon 3, Rocket League. Competitors will also be able to compete with their own systems on sports titles NBA2k 22/23 and Madden 22/23, and on mobile devices in League of Legends and Hearthstone.

How will our students benefit?

Our student participants in eSports will have many of the same benefits that our "traditional" athletes obtain from practices, scrimmages, and meets. They will work with staff coaches to improve critical thinking skills, learn to work as part of a team, and work effectively to communicate with each other in order to perform their best while competing in team events. A competitive eSports team will provide our 7-12 students with a social/team activity different from sports/music/theater, yet still have the flexibility to allow them to participate in those more "traditional" activities as well.

In addition, opportunities will exist for our students beyond competitive gaming. Students will provide behind-the-scenes tech support, build marketing skills (through a social media presence, advertising, and community partnerships), and further develop communication skills through broadcasting opportunities on multi-media platforms (such as Twitch, Discord, and YouTube).

What does this hold for our future?

eSports, design, implementation, and broadcasting are all viable career options for our students. Sponsorships are available for top-tier players and many colleges/universities offer scholarship opportunities for gamers. Many colleges and universities have created dedicated gaming labs for their teams. Ample scholarship opportunities exist for competitive eSports athletes and there are many degree paths and programs which exist for those that want to pursue eSports as a career. Colleges and universities are embracing eSports. In the 2021 fall semester, 49 SUNY campuses with 455 total teams participated in their eSports League. Collegiate representation within SUNY eSports alone includes:

- 22 Community Colleges
- 13 Comprehensive Colleges
- 8 University Centers and Doctoral Degree Granting Institutions, and
- 6 Technology Colleges ²

The creation of an eSports organization here at F-P is just the start of many new and exciting opportunities for our students in the coming years as we work to build a STEAM program to prepare our students for these and other potential careers of the future.

National FFA Convention

Four students from the Fabius-Pompey Chapter of FFA had the opportunity to attend the 95th National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana. We participated in many tours on our way to the conference, such as Apple Hills Farm



Market AgriTourism, Hollabaugh Bros. Inc. Orchard, Gettysburg Ghost Tours, Arlington National Cemetery, Holocaust Museum, West Virginia University, Anthony Thomas Chocolate Factory, Freshwater Farms, and South Side Landfill.



At the Apple Hills Farm Market AgriTourism in Binghamton, NY and the Hollabaugh Bros. Orchard in Biglerville, PA, we learned about how they run their orchards. That evening, we went on the Gettysburg Ghost Tour and got to learn about the history of Gettysburg and that it is haunted. The following day, we drove to Washington D.C. and visited Arlington National Cemetery and learned that they have about 26-28 memorials a day, and we were able to see the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier where the changing of the guards takes place.

At the Holocaust Museum we learned a lot about World War II. We also saw the Lincoln Memorial, the Jefferson Memorial, the Washington Monument, Vietnam Veterans Memorial, the Korean War Veterans

Memorial, World War II Memorial, and the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial. By the end of the day, we had walked close to 20,000 steps. We were exhausted.

On the third day, we toured the West Virginia University agricultural program. There we met a retired service dog named Ryder. In Ohio, we went to the chocolate factory and got to see



how chocolate is made and how much they make every day. They make about 60,000 pieces of Twix a day! That afternoon, we stopped at Freshwater Farms in Ohio. They had so many trout in pools inside and outside, and it was really cool to be able to feed them! We also visited the Southside Landfill in Indianapolis. We were surprised that it was connected to a golf course and that it did not smell.

At the Convention, we got to listen to Tamika Catchings, a four-time Olympic gold medalist, as our keynote speaker. We attended sessions during the day, including leadership trainer Coty Back, and were exposed to many colleges and agricultural businesses. We were thrilled to hear Lauren Alaina and Jimmie Allen in concert and attend the World's Toughest Rodeo.

It was an amazing experience, and I can't wait to do it again next year! I would like to thank Venture Farms and Greenwood Farms for their donation to help make this trip possible.
