FROM LLOYD L. PECK, ED.D. SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

As the leaves change color in Central New York, it always reminds me that we live in one of the most beautiful areas in the world. The mixture of the colors in the trees coupled with the backdrop of the mountains truly makes this area one of the most special in the state. It is also during this time that our students and staff really start to get settled back into a routine from their summer break.

Fall sports are starting to wind down and teams are entering sectional play or having their end of season team parties. Seasonal rituals such as the Communities Kickin' Cancer games and Trunk or Treat night at the Elementary School have occurred and the fall drama production is set to take place. Open House in the Elementary School and Middle School-High School was a success, and the first marking period is coming to an end. The students and staff are continuing to acclimate themselves to the different circumstances they find themselves in each and every day due to the pandemic, and whether it is contact tracing, mask wearing, distance seating or pool testing, they continue to shine. Speaking of the pandemic, it is very difficult these days to write the newsletter article without addressing COVID or the pandemic or at least giving the community an update. As a district and a society, COVID has become a part of our everyday lives and we have learned to cope with the pandemic for better or worse. The resilience of our youth and society to adapt to change is absolutely amazing.

As the school year continues, and it looks like a vaccine is on the horizon for children ages 5-11 for those who want it, maybe the pandemic will not be discussed in future articles, and hopefully students will not speak about other students being quarantined so nonchalantly in the future as they do today when this pandemic is finally over.

MIDDLE SCHOOL-HIGH SCHOOL NEWS Kevin Linck, Principal

I was recently reading through some of my old newsletter articles and found a quote that I had used from John Wooden years ago. The quote was, "Be more concerned with your character than your reputation, because your character is what you really are, while your reputation is merely what others think you are." The truth is we are often motivated through the thoughts about what other people think about us, rather than doing the right thing because it is in fact the right thing to do.

So many things are currently pressuring our students into doing things that they shouldn't do. In the past there were far fewer pressures in place. We would talk about peer pressure, but that was typically only when we were together with that group of people. Today, the people that are pressuring our students and our youth can come from anywhere in the world as a result of the internet, and specifically social media. Nowhere is this more displayed than through the tiktok challenges that run throughout the course of the school year. In the past we would identify that "character is what you do when no one is watching." Today we might identify that character is what you do when you are trying to get everyone to watch through social media. It is a scary time for our students when you think about these pressures that also include vaping, drugs and alcohol use, as well as other scary things that are sadly more and more accessible.

We did recently have a great example of our students doing something positive in our community. Students in 10th grade participated in the fall clean-up in our community, and it was a great success. Ashley Welch, our volunteer coordinator, set up a modified COVID-friendly volunteering experience and we had a great day for students and staff to help our community. The feedback that I got from places where students were involved was that they were friendly, respectful and hard working. I was very proud of their work ethic and their behavior. Please continue to reinforce these types of behaviors, as this is what we want from our students, as ultimately we want them to be good people, good citizens, and good neighbors.

Due to restrictions during the COVID-19 pandemic, special transportation requests for birthday parties and playdates cannot be honored. Seating is limited. If a bus change is necessary, please make your request at least seven days in advance to allow planning for properly distancing students.

ANNUAL WATER TEST RESULTS

In accordance with NYS Regulations, the Fabius-Pompey Central School District recently completed its mandated annual water testing. Each year, under NYS Regulations (Public Water Systems, Subpart 5-1), Onondaga County defines the parameters for water sampling, which public water systems must follow, including school districts utilizing their own wells. This year, as in past years, our school district water was tested on a monthly basis for microbiological contaminants and is tested annually for chemical contaminants, including nitrates and sodium.

This year's results remain consistent with the results of past years. The microbiological result is once again satisfactory and complies with the Onondaga County standard for drinking water. The nitrates result, at 6.08 mg/L in the Elementary School and 4.32 mg/L in the Middle School-High School, falls below the standard maximum contaminant level of 10 mg/L. Sodium levels tested at 99.2 mg/L in the Elementary School and 42.8 mg/L in the Middle School-High School.

These levels are normal for the school ground water source. There is no maximum contaminant level for sodium under the New York State Water Statute. Sodium occurs naturally in drinking water and poses no health hazard in and of itself. However, the NYS Water Statute states, "People on *severely* restricted sodium diets should not consume drinking water containing more than 20 mg/L." The Statute further states, "Water containing more than 270 mg/L should not be used for drinking by people who are on moderately restricted sodium diets." Our levels are less than one-half that amount.
