It is an honor to recognize those who have served our country, and we look forward to this special event again next year!
























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#### FROM THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

On December 5, the community approved the capital project for the F-P School District. We thank you for your support of this project. As we move forward during the next 12 to 15 months, our architectural firm will prepare the designs and documents to submit to the State Education Department for their review and approval. We expect that we will be able to go out to bid in 2025 with work to begin in the summer/fall of 2025 and be completed in 2026. Thus, the project is identified as, "Project 2026". As noted in last month's newsletter, a majority of the project is for facilities maintenance. For more specific information on the project, please review the BOE article in last month's F-P newsletter or go to the school website and review the information under the capital project vote: "Project 2026" link.

We would like to clear up some misunderstanding there may be regarding future increases to your taxes due to this project. Based upon the estimated cost of this project, and the current tax rate, we projected there will be an increase of \$.97 per thousand of your current assessed valuation. There were a couple questions regarding the difference of \$.68 increase in one informational article versus the \$.97 increase in the board article. We apologize for any confusion. There was nothing misleading about this. The \$.68 projected increase in some of the information prepared/sent out was based upon an estimated 100%, full value assessment. According to New York State, property in most of the townships in the district is only assessed at an average of 71% of true value. What does that mean? If your house is currently assessed at a value of \$100,000, and if reassessment was done, the new full value assessment would be \$142,000. Thus we projected at a current value assessment you would have a \$.97 increase per \$1000 value. More clearly stated, if your house is assessed at \$100,000, your tax rate would go up by \$97. If your house was assessed at a full value assessment, your house would be worth an actual \$142,000. Considering this full value assessment, taxes for your house would go up by \$68, or \$.68 per \$1000 of assessed valuation. As a board, we pride ourselves in being completely transparent to our community. I hope this clears up any confusion there may have been.

We are excited about moving forward. Pre-K is doing great. The STEAM Academy initiative is well underway. We have also refocused our attention on curriculum making sure we have a challenging and aligned P-12 educational program. We are also working on a strategic plan to focus our educational direction and provide guidelines to monitor the district's performance and success. January starts our budget season and over the next four months we will be working on developing the 2024-2025 school budget for your consideration at the May budget vote. We will focus more on each of these items in upcoming newsletters. We wish you a joyous holiday season and a wonderful new year.




#### STUDENT CHARGES

#### The Falcons Finish their Fall Sports Season Strong On and Off the Field

The fall sports season finished strong in November both on and off the field. Much of the success can be measured by records and championships. More importantly, success in the middle/high school setting can be measured by our student athletes' continued growth as young adults and how they continue to grow in the classroom. Success in sports usually correlates to success in the classroom.

The fall season on the field was highlighted by three championships and a State qualifier:

Boys' Varsity Soccer
OHSL Patriot American League Champions

**Boys' Varsity Soccer Class C Sectional Champions** 

Varsity Cross Country 9th Grader McKenna Johnson qualified for States!

## Varsity Football Independent League Champions

In addition to the championships and state qualifier, all six boys and girls soccer teams, modified though Varsity, finished with a combined record of 82 wins, 16 losses, and 5 ties. That means our soccer programs won more than 80% of their games. The cross country teams were second in the league and sectional tournaments. Lastly, football placed second in their division before upsetting two teams to win their league championship.

In the classroom, every Fabius-Pompey Varsity sport team earned the title of a Scholar Athlete team. In order to make this team, 75% of your team needs to average over a 90% grade point average. Even more incredible is the fact that 40 out of 64 were Scholar athletes with a 90% grade point average or better. 58 out of 64 (91%) varsity athletes made the Honor Roll list as a Honorable Mention, Honor Roll, or High Honor Roll student during the first marking period! In grades 7-12, we had 115 out of 136 (85%) of student athletes make the honor roll lists! Great Job, Fabius-Pompey Athletes!

#### **Get Involved, Get Active, and Get Educated!**

The impact of sports on learning is often misconstrued as a negative impact on learning because of the time commitment. Often students decide not to participate because they "want to work on their grades." As it should be, education takes priority over sports. However, research shows that youth sports have an overall positive impact on students. Many studies have been conducted to take a deeper look into what positive impact sports may have on students.

Studies show that athletics help students engage in their work and become more focused. A study from VU University in the Netherlands showed how exercising can improve the attention span of school pupils. A report from the Pediatrics Journal portrayed how students who exercise after school can improve their executive control. Based on this research and other credible scientific studies, children are much more capable to achieve in the classroom. The University of Illinois found a strong relationship between the fitness of children and their performance academically.

Here are 10 ways high school sports benefit students – some of which students and parents may not even realize.

- 1. Lower dropout rate and better day-to-day attendance.
- 2. Higher grades. The Minnesota State High School League did

- a survey in 2007 which was reported by the NFHS. The survey found that the average GPA of a high school athlete was 2.84, while a student who was not involved in athletics had an average GPA of 2.68.
- 3. More likely to attend college. "Those who participate in high school sports are 15 PERCENT more likely to attend college. A 2007 study revealed that women who played sports in high school were 73 PERCENT more likely to earn a college degree within six years of graduating high school. This was even true for women from disadvantaged backgrounds."-At Your Own Risk website.
- 4. More confidence and self-respect. Sport is all about success, achievement, teamwork and friendly competition. Everything from small words of encouragement from the coach to scoring the winning goal for their team can help build your child's confidence. A sense of pride is built when representing your community.
- **5. Time management.** Athletes must learn time management skills if they are to get everything finished. This leads to less procrastination, and a more focused work time.
- 6. Teamwork and leadership skills. More likely to climb the Corporate ladder. Teamwork is a vital skill in the working world. Any successful team is made up of individuals who can work with others. Working well with others and decision making are important leadership skills.
- 7. **Stronger relationships.** Close friendships with teammates, ability to lead and be led, and a closer sense of family. Positive mentors can range from coaches to captains. All of these are essential for mental, emotional, and physical health.
- **8. Less likely to get into trouble.** Those who participated in team sports are less likely to use drugs and smoke cigarettes.
- **9. Health.** CDC recommends one hour of physical activity every day. Less likely to experience obesity, have a lower incidence of heart disease, stroke or even cancer and, consequently, face lower health care costs in their lifetimes. Reduced stress and improved sleep are other health areas improved.
- **10. Perseverance.** Learning how to fail is an important skill. By learning how to lose, you learn how to work harder and this helps you succeed in life. Success comes from practice and a never give up attitude.

Fabius-Pompey has about a 70-80% participation rate of athletes that play at least one sport. Much of the success is due to many factors such as teachers, administrators, parent support and involvement, culture, and student dedication. Being able to have such a high participation rate in athletics, clubs, and the arts all create a culture that breeds success. There are ample opportunities for students at Fabius-Pompey to get involved, stay active, and improve their well being.
