FROM THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Board of Education Member Retires

It is with great appreciation for his service and deep regret that we accept the resignation of Don Neugebauer from the Board of Education. The loss of his institutional knowledge on board service and governance is vast. Don has been a member of the school board for over 23 years. During his tenure, Don served as board president for 17 years. In addition to being highly respected by the community, local board members, administrators, and staff at F-P, Don also earned the respect of many educational leaders across Central New York.

His dedication to education and reach went beyond Fabius-Pompey. He was also a member of the board of directors for the Central New York School Board Association, serving as their president for 11 years.

Don epitomizes the values of inclusion, collegiality, respect, comportment, preparation, and governance that it takes to be a great leader. Most importantly, his level of collegiality and fair mindedness has greatly contributed to a cohesion among board members, even when there are strongly held opposing points of view. The loss of Don's service to our school district and the educational community will be missed.

As the board looks forward, we will be accepting letters of intent from individuals interested in filling the vacated position to serve on the school board for the four months remaining of Don's current term. It is our intention to review these letters of intent at the BOE meeting on Tuesday, February 6. All persons interested in being on the school board will have the opportunity to run for a new three-year term in May.

Strategic Planning Committee

As a new initiative for school year 2023-2024, community members, teachers, staff, and board members have gathered in a committee that is focused on how we can provide the best education, support, and opportunities for our students. The group has met twice and focused on what makes our school unique, how we can capitalize on these qualities, and looking to the future on how we can create student success. It became clear that our small size, attention to detail, and teacher commitment to individual success is a hallmark of Fabius-Pompey. Teachers and administrators work together to deal with any specific student issues.

An area the committee is focusing on is how can we better prepare our students for their individual success as they prepare for the next phase of their life, whether it is future education or workforce placement. Discussions and planning focused on ensuring students are technologically ready, challenged with hands-on learning and have experience working with collaborative teams.

Traditional methods of lecture and test preparation are critically important but require growth to meet the global employment trends. The workforce is constantly changing, and college classes are becoming more career strategic to enable students to enter the workforce with strong technology skills. Team teaching that simulates project-based work approaches, technology use, critical thinking and problem solving are areas of focus for the team to include in the strategic plan. The STEAM Academy is one new approach that enables all students to try different courses that are project based. These courses are certified and applicable to various professions for students looking to enter the workforce or continue their education at a collegiate level. Our current AP and dual enrollment courses engage students, prepare them for college, and are an affordable way for our high school students to earn credits. One area of focus in the strategic plan is CTE internships that will allow students to combine traditional classes and practical work experience. These are great opportunities for resume building and college applications.

The Elementary School has several new teachers this year that are working together with existing staff for an integrated curriculum for all classrooms. They are working as a team to enhance the reading, math and writing skills of our students. The goal is to enhance the elementary experience to align with higher grade levels.

As we continue to develop the strategic plan, the committee continues to develop initiatives that will increase students' scores, learning, and overall academic successes.


Explore Business and Finance with the Fabius-Pompey STEAM Academy

The Food Pantry at the Delphi Falls United Church is open 10 a.m. to noon on the following Saturdays: February 3 & 17.


