FROM THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Dear Fabius-Pompey Community,

One of the responsibilities of the Board of Education is to ensure that our facilities stay in shape and meet the needs of our students and staff. During the last few years, we have been busy dealing with Covid and working through a change in district and school leadership. After working through these changes and paying off some past capital debt we are now ready to proceed with a new capital project.

During the past year, the Fabius-Pompey Central School District has been working with SEI, an architectural design group, to complete a comprehensive study to assist the Board of Education with immediate and long-term facilities planning. We are required by the state to do a facility needs review like this every five years. As part of this review, the architectural group did a thorough study on building needs. To help with this review and prepare the report, SEI also met with the District leadership team, staff, maintenance department, and board facilities committee for input on our building needs and educational programming needs. A report was prepared with the suggested items to be included in the current capital project and items needed for future, long-term planning. During the past several months, the board facilities committee met with the architect, the District leadership team and staff. We carefully reviewed and discussed the proposed recommendations in the study. We prioritized the needs of the District, considering physical building needs along with items needed to enhance student education and learning. The last big project had a concentration of updates in the Elementary School. This time we have a concentration of facilities work in the Middle School-High School.

This project consists of safety, maintenance and facility updates to keep our buildings in shape and to meet the educational needs of our students. Some of the project work for the buildings and site improvements along with student needs is identified below. To reduce the project cost the board decided to hold off on some of the architectural firm's recommended updates. These updates will be included in a future capital project.

This project includes:

Elementary School:

Security upgrades; including upgrades to support cameras. Maintenance upgrades; including water tank and parking lot repair. Athletic fields; work on the varsity, JV and modified ball fields, dugouts and fences.

Middle School-High School:

Security upgrades; including upgrades to support cameras and to update/replace the fire alarm and PA system. Maintenance upgrades; work on windows in the Middle School area. Asbestos abatement. Bathroom renovations to meet code. Water tank replacement. Replace rooftop heating ventilation/cooling units. Modifications and upgrades in the cafeteria. Replacement of high school gym floor. Renovate tech room and classroom areas to support STEAM educational programming. Athletic field; soccer field, lighting and bleachers.

During November we held meetings with community groups to discuss the project and answer questions. A public presentation was held on Tuesday, November 28, at 6:00 p.m. in the Middle School-High School auditorium to discuss the project. If you were unable to attend the meeting and have questions, please feel free to contact any board member. Building Updates

STEAM Academy - Career & Technical Education Business Program. We have been working hard with the New York State Department of Education and have completed documentation for our Career & Technical Education Business Program application. If approved, Fabius-Pompey Central School District will have a fully accredited Career & Technical Education Business Program at the start of the 2024-2025 school year. This will give students the opportunity to earn a Career & Technical Education Business Program graduation credential through specially designed curriculum and work-based learning experiences in the business sector.

Interfaith Works - Fabius-Pompey Middle School and H.W. Smith Pre-K through 8 School. Our guidance counseling team has teamed up with staff from H.W. Smith Pre-K through 8 School and Interfaith Works of CNY to provide Middle School students, grades 7th and 8th, from Fabius-Pompey and H.W. Smith opportunities for community-wide dialogue to explore and develop an understanding for each other's culture.

6th **Grade W.I.N.** Our 6th grade team has kicked off the 2023-2024 school year with W.I.N. (What I Need). W.I.N. is a student-centered, 30 minute, individualized academic support block for students. Students receive academic intervention in core content, homework help, and enrichment during the first period of their school day.

Fall Chorus Concert. Our Middle School-High School choral program presented their fall concert on Wednesday, November 1. 


SPANISH CLASS NEWS
















MUSIC DEPARTMENT NEWS
