Commitment to Fiscal Responsibility

- Ensuring transparency and open communication
- Balancing rising costs and economic constraints
- Minimizing the impact of budget reductions on academics
- Strategic adjustments for long-term sustainability

Key Financial Challenges

- Limited increase in State Aid (\$120K increase, potential \$180K)
- Property tax cap restricts revenue increase (\$200K limit)
- Federal funding uncertainties for special education & Title I
- Rising costs in health insurance, wages, utilities, and materials

Budget Reduction Overview

- Total budget reductions: \$1.55 million
- Focus on preserving core academic offerings
- Strategic adjustments to minimize student impact
- Staff reductions through retirements and vacancies

Instructional Staff Adjustments

- MS/HS Mathematics Position
- MS/HS Physical Education Position
- MS/HS .4 Art Position
- MS/HS Spanish Position reallocated to ELL Instruction
- Elementary Teacher (class size shift)
- Elementary Social Worker
- District-Wide School Psychologist (Vacant)

Non-Instructional Adjustments

- Two Licensed Teaching Assistants (LTAs)
- Three Teacher Aides (one vacant position)
- School Monitor
- Secretary Position (Retirement)
- Custodian Position (Vacant Position)
- Bus Route (Vacant Position)

Protecting Academic Programs

- Secondary-level curriculum remains largely intact
- Only one elective course eliminated
- Elementary school: one grade level adjusted for class sizes
- Prioritizing student services and support systems

Understanding Capital Project Funds

- Separate from General Fund (cannot be used for salaries)
- Funds are state-aided for long-term facility improvements
- Ensuring compliance with legal and financial regulations
- Maintaining financial accountability for future funding

Community Engagement & Next Steps

- Discuss financial strategies for long-term stability
- Potential need for a supermajority vote
- Encouraging community feedback and participation
